Description of Proposed Module: Some ABE/GED students may not know what is meant by sustainability or how it applies to their lives. Once they have a better understanding of this, they may have practices or suggestions regarding what they are already doing or could do to live in a more sustainable manner. The proposed module for ABE/GED classes would include: 1) examining the environmental, economic and social justice aspects of sustainability, 2) presenting examples of sustainable lifestyle choices through a cooperative learning model, and 3) giving students a writing assignment to show how these concepts can be applied.
